 - To inculcate value based education among the students
 - To develop a positive attitude between education institution and society for manual benefits by socio- economic and cultural transformation.
- **3. The Context:** The Institution is located in rural area, due to which many students face difficulties in upgrading the knowledge and skills. Since, the inception of the institution the founder Shri Kundalikrao Jagtap Patil had a dream to make student able to face the employment opportunities to the marginalized section of the society. Industrialization and globalization have created a lot of job opportunities, but rural students seem to lack of confidence. To cope with this competitive environment and to make rural students stand by themselves, with this liberal view soft skill development programme which is introduced by Savitribai Phule Pune University, have been started.

The criteria and admission process of SSDPs are as follows:

Information about the SSDPs admission process is available in the prospectus, also displayed on the notice board and the college website

- Admission for soft skill development Programme is restricted to only 50 students
- From Second and Third year UG students, interested students are admitted
- The programme is designed by the Parent University and institution runs the programme. The experts from these areas from various colleges, Parents, Alumni, are invited for speech on the topics.
- The institution has appointed the coordinator for soft skill development Programme for the smooth functioning

- Classes of SSDPs are conducted between the regular sessions which is for 10 days every year
- Library provides books of eminent and successful entrepreneurs, various journals, and magazines
- The evaluation process of SSDPs is carried out through feedbacks of presentation, group discussion and other activities related to the programme.
- Certificates are awarded to students by the institution

5. Evidence of Success:-

2. SELF- DEFENCE PROGRAM FOR COLLEGE GIRLS

1. Title of the practice: Self- Defence Program for College Girls

2. The context that required the initiation of the practice:-

Today girls are feeling insecure due to their lack of confidence and being their girlhood. It is our honest effort to make them aware of their strength and build up the confidence among girl students so that they should come out of their inferiority complex through education and such training programme of self-defence.

3. Objectives of the practice:-

The programme like self-defence will encourage them to build their strength and they should think carefree from the dangers. The main objective of this programme is to make them aware of the dangers in the society. They should know how to tackle the difficult situation if they are alone in the society. This will increase the mind set off lot of girls in different way by protecting themselves.

4. The Practice

The college organizes five day (11th-15th December 2016) training program for the girls students of the college. The program was basically formed for the self defence of the girls of the college. This program was initiated by our college principal Dr. Shantilal Ghegade. More than 25 girls were participated in this program. Director of Tiekwondo Association Shri. Santosh Bargaje was the skilled trainer to train the girls. Physical Dierector Dr. Ravindra shirke was associated with him in this training program. Through this training program girls learnt many skills of Taikowokdo like Kicks, punch, spiring technique, throwing, phumse etc. by the success of this program our college look forward to organise such programs in future also.

5. Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome them

The training program is organized in the month of December which happens to be an eventful phase of the winter season. Events of the series take place on the open ground of the college. Out of the five days, the winter disturbs the activity on one or the other day. College assumed that more than 100 girls will participate but only 25 girls were interested to attend this program.

6. Impact of the practice:-

The self-defence training program has great impact on the girls students. Learning from the skilled trainers from all types of defence styles initiates the process of empowering the girls. It is seen that students, in particular, learn how to protect them from danger.
